MAYORS' MESSAGE



I look forward to working with our new council. Individually each member brings skills, experiences and connections to interest groups throughout the community. Collectively, when working together as a team, we can achieve much. Our first gathering on October 28th was to attend a council workshop to review important bylaws relating to how we as a council work together and what the function of the mayor and council are. We first reviewed our Procedures Bylaw followed by our Code of Conduct Bylaw, and our Workplace Harassment Policy. It's important to get off on the right foot.

Already our calendars are filling up with meetings and tasks that will keep us busy well into the new year and beyond. We begin by attending a two-day orientation meeting at the end of November in Whitehorse hosted by Association of Yukon Committees for all Councils and CAO's, followed by drafting a provisional budget, a Strategic Planning Workshop, a Community Emergency Measures Planning exercise. The heavy lifting begins in February with several meetings to finalize our 2025 capital and operational budgets.

Our CAO, Larry Baran, has given notice that he will be retiring on May 31st so, in January, we will begin recruitment efforts to find a new CAO. The advance notice gives us time to fill the position. Normally this effort can take a few months.



Local Notary Public, Deb Carreau, performed the duty of administering the Oath of Office and Oath of Allegiance for the in-coming Council on October 22nd. She first administered the Oaths to Mayor Jack Bowers (pictured left), and then to the four Councillors. Councillors Neil Yee, Wendy Michell-Larocque. Michelle Vainio, and Gary Jones then took their seats for the balance of the meeting. Councillor Vainio later accepted the first one-year term as Deputy Mayor. and Councillor Jones accepted the first one-year term as the Association of Yukon Communities representative for the Town of Faro.

Also in attendance, and representing the Yukon Government, was Ms Amanda Janssens, Community Advisor for the Town of Faro.



PUBLIC WORKS & OPERATIONS UPDATES



MESSAGE FROM THE OPERATIONS MANAGER

PAUL MEDVID

With the retirement of Mark Vainio, after many years of exemplary service, I was hired as the new Operations Manager for the Town after previously serving on Council during the previous term. Although I bring a great deal of my own experience to the role, Mark raised the bar and set a higher standard of service along with providing mentorship and leadership throughout the transition.

Following is a brief report on the current status of projects underway with the Faro Public Works Department.

Public Works Crew: Work is slowed on our Distribution Pumphouse 3 Backup Generator project as production delays means we now won't see the generator until January. That will give us time to have all other work completed and be ready to plug it in. Our new Water Well #6 is ready for commissioning. Public Works has completed adapting the pitless well pump into the new well casing and tying in the water main and electrical. The Public Works crew did an amazing job of decommissioning old Well #5 as per Yukon CSR Protocol 7. Flow testing and sampling is underway, and we'll be putting it into service soon. We also have projects to clean-up/ upgrade the power to our Water Treatment Plant, electrical upgrades to Well-house One, Pump replacement and install a bleeder system into this well as it has no frost protection. Hydrants have been inspected, repaired and winterized.

Landfill Operations: In 2024, we'll be training some of our crew on Solid Waste Management and do some more improvements on how we handle our solid waste. The crew has installed shelving into the electronic waste container which helps with sorting considerably. Please don't pile up your electronics at the door – put them on the shelves or in the bins. We drilled 3 new monitoring wells and one replacement well this year. All are now in service. We're accepting hazardous household waste in a shed beside the Office. We accept this material (paint, aerosol cans, etc) year round. Our new Landfill Operator/Bylaw Enforcement Officer is tasked with ensuring waste goes in the proper areas. Household waste, animal parts and excrement get bagged and put in the garbage dumpsters. This is not a new Bylaw, but is now being enforced. If that waste gets mixed with construction debris, it becomes an animal attractant which is something we must avoid.

<u>Projects:</u> Ladue Drive property update – all work is completed with the exception of realignment of the Golf Course access road. Lots are currently for sale by Lottery with YG Lands. The Town of Faro has been developing a local Contractor List to assist us in upcoming projects in collaboration with Yukon Govt or with our own projects. The Town of Faro will accept applicants throughout the year. Construction of a new Animal Shelter will be starting sometime late this fall once the design is completed. With the latest changes to the building codes, it is now required to be an Engineered Design.

Gardening: Reminder to not drive ATV's or vehicles on the grass areas of Town as it can severely damage the grass and can take considerable time and effort to repair. Funding approval has been granted for the 2024 FireSmart project, so the Town will be proceeding with another project this year and our planned area is along the lower level of Douglass Drive. The roof on the greenhouse has been replaced so that asset is protected for years to come. We've been doing considerable brushing around our buildings, reservoirs, and some trail work this year and we plan to continue these improvements as long as weather permits.
