- Pecuniary Interest as set out in S 193.01(1) and highlighted the requirement for this to be a potential financial impact
- Section 193.01(2) was reviewed as set out in legislation
- Section 193.01(3) identifies exceptions to the rules where either the Council Members interests are the same as all other taxpayers, utility customers, or so remote or insignificant that it can't be regarded as likely to influence. It also doesn't apply to Council setting its own allowances, honorariums or per diems.

Councillor Michell-Laroque entered the meeting at this point.

- Examples to test whether a member has a pecuniary interest
- The differences between Perceived vs Actual Pecuniary Interest and the importance of being transparent when a perception of a conflict exists by simply identifying it during a public meeting.
- The requirement to vote on matters and the process to request permission to be excused from voting
- Society executive members versus general members was discussed, using the example of the Faro Golf Club.

- The Ice Worm Squirm was well attended, and she heard a lot of positive feedback.

Councillor Neil Yee

- The Ice Worm Squirm was great with lots of activities for various age groups. Unfortunate to see that the cold-weather events were cancelled and also unfortunate that with the loss of the gazebo there was no ability to use that space for the outdoor events. It was also sad that no apology was provided directly to the town by the individual responsible for the fire that caused the damage to the gazebo.

Budget

- Initial reviews were completed by Council at the March 12 and 13 Special Meetings with a recommendation to include a First Reading on the March 17, 2026, Regular Meeting.
- Water/Sewer/Garbage Fees have identified for further analysis a rate review by Council later in 2026.
- Capital priorities were identified, with consideration of Strategic Plan and operational capacities.

Housing Accelerator Fund (HAF)

- Residential Conversion Grant Policy was approved February 3, 2026 by Council.
- Website updates have been approved and posted, including the application form. Deadline for submissions will be May 1, 2026 at 4:00 p.m.
- Public Communication plan has been developed and will be implemented starting March 16. Print format will be mailed out and social media text has been prepared.
- An in-person information session will be held March 25 (afternoon/evening) & March 26 (morning) for members of the public. Advertising will follow.

Official Community Plan / Zoning Bylaw Updates

- OCP review and update initiated and anticipated to be coordinated with the Zoning Bylaw's third reading.

Bylaw Enforcement

- Several complaints have been received re: animal control bylaw, and snow removal / snow stockpiling. Warning letters and fines have been issued, as necessary.
 - Some concerns that have been identified about snow removal will require the development and adoption of a new bylaw to enforce issues.

Land Matters

- The Town's sale of 605 Yates Crescent has been completed.

- Responding to inquires for surplus town properties (triplex on Hoole, duplex on Harper, vacant property on Dawson) following the CBC article on housing availability in Faro. Updated advertising is begin developed and will be posted on the website soon.
- Administrative review of severance and consolidation procedures in line with Council's direction and public inquiries.

Employment Matters

- Violence, Discrimination and Harassment Policy – Internal training has been rescheduled.
- Job description / posting / hiring process reviews are underway in anticipation of Summer Seasonal work.

**A Bylaw to Adopt the
2026 Operating Budget**

WHEREAS Section 238 (1) of the Municipal Act, provides that on or before April 15 in each year, Council shall cause to be prepared and adopted by bylaw an annual operating budget;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Town of Faro, in open meeting assembled, hereby **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. TITLE

- 1.1. This bylaw may be cited as the "**2026 Operating Budget Bylaw**".

2. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 2.1. This Bylaw authorizes the expenditure of funds for the normal maintenance and operations of the Town of Faro for the 2026 fiscal year.
- 2.2. The 2026 Annual Operating Budget attached hereto as Schedule "A" and forming part of this bylaw, is hereby adopted.
- 2.3. The expenditures referred to in Schedule "A" shall not be amended or varied in such a manner which increases the total expenditure, except by Bylaw.
- 2.4. Notwithstanding Clause 2.3 Council may by a unanimous resolution, reallocate or reassign funding within the budget provided that the total expenditures authorized by this bylaw are not exceeded.

3. COMING INTO FORCE

- 3.1. This Bylaw shall come into force and have effect from and after the date of third reading thereof.

**A Bylaw to Adopt the
2026 Capital Budget and Expenditures Program**

WHEREAS Section 238 (2) of the Act provides that on or before April 15 in each year, the Council shall cause to be prepared the annual capital budget for the current year and the capital expenditure program for the next three financial years and shall by bylaw adopt these budgets;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Town of Faro, in open meeting assembled, hereby **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. TITLE

1.1. This bylaw may be cited as the "**2026 Capital Budget Bylaw**".

2. GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1. This Bylaw authorizes the expenditure of funds for the acquisition of assets in accordance Schedule A of this bylaw.

2.2. The 2026 Capital Budget and Capital Expenditures Program, attached hereto as Schedule "A" and forming part of this bylaw, is hereby adopted.

2.3. The expenditures referred to in Schedule "A" shall not be amended or varied in such a manner which increases the total expenditure, except by Bylaw.

3. COMING INTO FORCE

3.1. This Bylaw shall come into force and have effect from and after the date of third reading thereof.

**A Bylaw to Adopt the
2026 Property Tax Rates**

WHEREAS Section 55 (2) of the Assessment and Taxation Act (“Taxation Act”), being Chapter 13 of the Revised Statutes of the Yukon, 2002, states that each taxing authority shall, by bylaw made on or before April 15 in each year, levy taxes in accordance with this Act on all taxable real property that is in its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS Section 55 (3) (c) of the Taxation Act states that a taxing authority may, in respect of taxes levied under this section, establish different classes of real property, and vary the tax rate according to the class of real property to be taxed; and

WHEREAS Sections 60 (1) of the Taxation Act states that except as provided by subsection (2), the minimum tax payable in any year under Section 55 is \$100 in respect of the total assessed value of any real property under subsection 13(7); and

WHEREAS Sections 60 (2) of the Taxation Act states that a municipality may by bylaw provide for a different amount for the minimum tax payable under subsection (1) in respect of real property located in the municipality, and it may establish a minimum amount of tax for land on which there is no improvements that is different from the minimum amount of tax for other real property;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Town of Faro, in open meeting assembled, hereby **ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. TITLE

- 1.1. This bylaw may be cited as the **"2026 Property Tax Rates Bylaw"**.

2. DEFINITIONS

- 2.1. In this bylaw:

“Residential” means all classes of real property used primarily for residential use, other than Country Residential, and are designated on the assessment roll as RS1, RS2, RCM, RMH, or RSM.

“Non-residential” means all classes of real property used primarily for commercial, industrial and public purposes and are designated on the

assessment roll as CMC, CMH, CML, CMS, INS, MHI, MSI, OSP, PRC, or QRY.

“Country Residential” means all classes of real property designated on the assessment roll as REC or RSC.

“Unimproved” means all real property under any of the above designations on which there are no improvements assessed.

“Assessment Roll” means the current Town of Faro Assessment Roll.

“Total Assessment” means the combined total of the assessed value of land and improvements for real property as listed on the tax roll.

3. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 3.1. This Bylaw establishes the tax regime for all properties within the municipal boundary of the Town of Faro.
- 3.2. There shall be levied upon all taxable Residential real property in the Town of Faro, a general tax for 2026 at the rate of 1.68 percent of the total assessment.
- 3.3. There shall be levied upon all taxable Non-Residential real property within the Town of Faro a general tax for 2026 at the rate of 1.94 percent of the total assessment.
- 3.4. There shall be levied upon all taxable Country Residential real property in the Town of Faro a general tax for 2026 at the rate of 1.49 percent of the total assessment.
- 3.5. There shall be levied upon all taxable Unimproved real property within the Town of Faro a general tax for 2026 at the rate of 2.06 percent of the total assessment.
- 3.6. As provided for under Section 60(2) of the Act, a minimum tax shall be applied when the percent rate applicable under Sections 3, 4, or 5 results in an amount less than the minimum tax of:
 - 3.6.1. three hundred eleven dollars (\$311) for all taxable Residential and Non-Residential real properties; or,

3.6.2. two hundred seven dollars (\$207) for all other taxable real properties.

3.7. If any section, sub-section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Bylaw is for any reason held invalid, the validity of the remaining sections of the Bylaw shall not be affected by the decision.

4. COMING INTO FORCE

4.1. This Bylaw shall come into force and have effect from and after the date of third reading thereof.

A Bylaw to Amend the Procedures Bylaw for the Town of Faro to regulate the proceedings of meetings and identify meeting procedures for the transaction of business

WHEREAS Section 210 of the Municipal Act, RSY 2002, c. 154 (the Act), provides that Council shall, by bylaw, make rules governing its meeting procedures; and

WHEREAS notice of a proposed amendment to the Procedures Bylaw must be given at the Regular Meeting preceding the Council Meeting at which the first reading of the amendment will occur (s. 210 (3)(b) of the Act);

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Town of Faro in the Yukon Territory hereby enacts an amended Procedures Bylaw in the form attached in Schedule "A"; and,

FURTHER THAT Bylaw No. 2007-05 is hereby repealed; and,

FURTHER THAT that this bylaw shall come into full force and effect upon final passing thereof.

RE: Harrassment Investigation Outcomes following Third-Party Investigation

Dear Minister Bellmore,

The Council of the Town of Faro completed five (5) third-party investigations of harassment complaints that were lodged in 2025. These were completed in response to Orders received from the Workers Safety and Compensation Board.

This process was difficult for all involved, and exposed areas for improvement in several aspects of municipal operations such as:

- policies and procedures
- comprehensive Council, employee and volunteer training; and
- civility in the workplace

We have initiated work implementing the recommendations and we are hopeful these changes will improve our operations.

I am writing today to request support from the Yukon Government to address some of the recommendations that are beyond the municipality's jurisdiction, specifically:

- That the Municipal Act be amended to include a requirement for Councils to adopt a Code of Conduct;
- That the Municipal Act be amended to provide a mechanism for accountability and enforcement of a municipality's Code of Conduct;
- That the Department of Community Services provide dedicated, human resources to support Councils and to assist them in resolving and addressing complex issues prior to escalation; and,

- That the Department of Community Services and the Department of Health and Social Services work together to promote and provide access to mental health supports for employees and citizens of the Town of Faro relating to the trauma experienced in the 2021 shootings in Faro;

I have copied the Honourable Brad Cathers on this letter, since the fourth recommendation includes the Department of Health and Social Services as well as the Department of Community Services.

Please be advised that our CAO, Kimberly Ballance, has submitted the proposed Municipal Act amendments to the Department of Community Services and its Municipal Act Review Committee for their consideration during the legislative review process. Nonetheless, I wanted to highlight the importance of these amendments to the Town of Faro as they will assist in the improvement of accountability and transparency within the municipal sector.

1. This licence does not convey any exclusive right, privilege, possession, property or interest with respect to the Land.

USE

2. The *Licensee* shall use the Land solely for the following purpose(s):

To maintain existing structures and land use for the purpose of an arboretum.

TERM

3. This licence shall be for a period of **Thirty (30) years** commencing on the **First (1st) day of April 2026** and ending on the **Thirty First (31st) day of March 2056**.
4. **YIELDING AND PAYING THEREFORE**, annually, and in advance, a licence fee in the sum of **One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150.00)** plus GST.
5. The *Licensee* shall not use the *Land* for any other purpose than use(s) specified in clause 2.
6. The breach of any clause shall be a fundamental breach of the licence and may result in termination.

LICENCE FEE REVIEW

7. The licence fee shall be reviewed after five years from the effective date of the licence and every five years thereafter for the duration of the licence term.

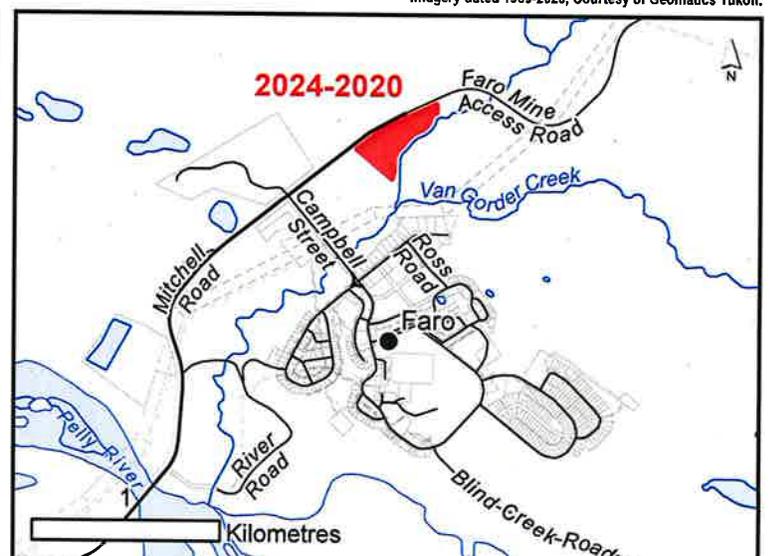

IMPROVEMENTS

8. The *Licensee* shall not place anything permanent upon, in, or under the *Land*, except as necessary for the exercise of the rights granted under this licence, without the written approval of the Minister. Furthermore, the *Licensee* will construct, operate and maintain such necessary improvements in a good, workmanlike and proper manner.
9. Prior to construction the *Licensee* must submit a construction plan complete with survey drawings, equipment list, methods and techniques and time frame for approval by the Minister.
10. The *Licensee* will not cut or damage any timber on the *Land* or open, lay down or construct any roads or trails on or over the *Land*, or do any act to impair the natural beauty of the *Land*, except in the manner and to the extent that Minister may allow for the reasonable exercise of the rights granted under this licence.
11. On the termination or expiration of this licence, the *Licensee* will remediate the *Land* to a condition satisfactory to the Minister. In particular, the Minister may require the *Licensee* to remove any improvements affixed to or placed on the *Land*, and any chattels or other property placed on the *Land*, and otherwise to restore the *Land*. In the event the *Licensee* does not carry out such removals and restoration within ninety (90) days of termination of the licence, despite being requested to do so, the Minister may carry out the removals and restoration and may recover the cost of so doing from the *Licensee*.

ENVIRONMENTAL

12. The *Licensee* shall dispose of all timber and slash cleared on the *Land* in accordance with direction from the Forest Officer and satisfactory to the Minister.
13. The *Licensee* will not cut any trees or shrubs outside the *Land* boundaries.
14. If the *Licensee* by its operations on the *Land* has contributed to any detrimental environmental change, the *Licensee* shall pay its proportionate share of any costs of remedial action which may be considered necessary, as determined by the Minister.
15. The *Licensee* will take all reasonable precautions to prevent any fire occurring or spreading on the *Land* and will pay all reasonable costs of suppressing or containing any fire caused by or attributable to the negligence of the *Licensee*, its officers, employees, contractors, servants, agents, or successors.

FUEL AND HAZARDOUS CHEMICALS

16. The *Licensee* shall take all reasonable precautions to prevent the possibility of migration of spilled petroleum fuel over the ground surface or through seepage in the ground.
17. The *Licensee* shall take all reasonable precautions to prevent the migration of petroleum products into bodies of water.
18. The *Licensee* shall handle, store, dispose and keep records of all hazardous and toxic chemicals in accordance with the law.
19. The *Licensee* shall ensure that fuel storage containers are not located within thirty point four-eight (30.48) metres of the ordinary high water mark of any body of water unless otherwise authorized by the Minister.
20. The *Licensee* shall establish and maintain fuel storage and dispensing facilities in accordance with applicable federal, territorial, local regulations, municipal acts, zoning, permits, or by-laws. No spilled or leaked fuel shall be allowed to spread to surrounding lands or into any waters. Liquid-tight containers or

sumps shall be placed below each tap, valve and nozzle used to dispense fuel.

21. The *Licensee* will be required to undertake such corrective measures as may be specified by the Minister and in accordance with applicable laws and regulations, in the event of waste spill on the land or water, resulting from the *Licensee's* operations.

ASSIGNMENT

22. That the *Licensee* **may not assign this licence**, or sublet this licence or the privileges or rights hereby conferred **except with the written consent of Yukon**. If *Yukon* consents to an assignment the *Licensee* shall pay any outstanding licence fees and furnish *Yukon* with a properly executed unconditional assignment document in duplicate of the licence together with an assignment registration fee of \$10.00 and proof that all taxes on the licence have been paid.

GENERAL

23. The *Licensee* shall conform to all applicable federal, territorial, and municipal laws.
24. The *Licensee* is responsible for and shall pay all taxes, local improvement rates and assessments and all public utility charges respecting the *Land* during the term of this licence.
25. This licence does not authorize a right of access to a highway nor does it authorize a right of access over, upon, or along a highway right-of-way.
26. *Yukon* assumes no liability expressed or implied, to provide access to the *Land*.
27. That the *Licensee* shall hold *Yukon* free of all liabilities concerning the *Land* during the term of this licence, and shall indemnify and save harmless *Yukon*, from and against all actions, claims, demands, costs and damages whatsoever resulting from all uses of the *Land*, or anything done or omitted to be done by, the *Licensee*, his servants, agents and employees, save and except for damages caused by *Yukon*.
28. That unless a waiver is given in writing by the Minister, the Minister will not be deemed to have waived any breach by the *Licensee* of any of the terms of the licence, and a waiver relates only to the specific breach to which it refers.
29. Termination of this licence will not prejudice a right of action by *Yukon* with respect to the breach of any of the terms and conditions contained in the licence.
30. Time shall be of the essence of this licence.
31. In this licence "Minister" means the Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources and any person authorized to act on the Minister's behalf.

32. In the event that any portion of the licence fee remains unpaid after it becomes due, whether formally demanded or not, or if the *Licensee* is in default of any other term of this licence, upon serving the notices and if the default is not remedied to the satisfaction of *Yukon*, *Yukon* may cancel this licence. Such cancellation will be effective immediately.
